This full-time position as clinical or tenure track assistant or associate professor includes leading the Graduate Orthodontic program. Additionally, the faculty member will participate in the section's teaching, research and patient care programs. Preference will be given to applicants with demonstrated expertise in clinical care, scholarship and program administration. This appointment potentially could lead to director of the Division's graduate clinic.

Required qualifications include: (1) D.M.D., D.D.S. degree, or equivalent, (2) advanced training in Orthodontics and ABO Board certification. Applicants must be eligible for licensure in Ohio. Academic rank and salary will be based on the candidate's qualifications and experience. An intramural practice opportunity is available. Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled.
